Epidemic situation in Europe

The incidence curves of the Covid-19 epidemic have stabilised in the European countries where the group is present and have fallen slightly in Spain.

This favourable evolution of the incidence for several consecutive days has enabled many countries to envisage a reduction in measures, even if the fear of a third wave linked to the high contagiousness of the new variants remains valid.

Epidemic situation and screening in the Korian network

The improvement of the situation is confirmed in our network with a drop in the number of Covid-19 people and a drop in the number of establishments affected.

On 4th of February, 190 retirement homes had at least one positive case, i.e. 22% of the European network compared to 203 last week. 1,904 residents were tested positive for coronavirus, which is 150 less than previous week.

108 of the affected establishments had 4 case or more (4S) against 114 last week, i.e. 12,6% of the medico-social network.

40 establishments emerged from the epidemic phase last week, including 17 in Germany, among which several were in 4S.

As always since the beginning of this second wave, the vast majority of people who tested positive - over 95 % - remain asymptomatic or pauci-symptomatic.

Since 1st of November, 10,337 residents have recovered from Covid-19, including 3,900 since the beginning of the year and 650 in the last 7 days. In total, more than 17,250 residents have recovered from Covid-19 since the beginning of the epidemic.

Vaccination campaign

The vaccination campaign continues throughout the network according to the protocols and pace defined by each health authority in the different territories. No slowdown linked to any supply is to be deplored. The campaign is scheduled to end at the end of the first quarter of 2021. In addition, the arrival on the market of AstraZeneca's vaccine, which is easier to store, should further facilitate access to vaccination.

As of today, 65% of residents, and 34% of the workforce have been vaccinated.

In France, 63% of our residents that have received their first injection and nearly 3,500 employees.

In Germany, more than 51% of our residents are vaccinated with an acceptance rate of 90% and 6,870 employees with an acceptance rate above 57%.

In Spain, the campaign is finished. 96% of residents are vaccinated.

In Italy, nearly 72% of our residents are vaccinated, and 4,000 employees.

In Belgium, 85% of our residents are vaccinated as well as nearly 2,630 employees. Refusal rates are stable at around 5% for residents and 30% for employees.

In the Netherlands, 69% of residents and more than 940 employees are vaccinated.

Hygiene standard and preventive measures

New mutations, such as that of variant B.1.1.7 identified by the United Kingdom last December, raise fears of a resurgence in incidence due to their greater contagiousness.

Although there is no scientific evidence for the moment to suggest greater danger or resistance to currently available vaccines, this high contagiousness does raise fears of a possible third wave. This situation calls for the utmost vigilance in the respect of barrier gestures and the rapid deployment of vaccination.

Reinforced measures have been taken to prevent the circulation of more contagious variants, through a preventive reinforcement of stocks of personal protective equipment; a widening of safety distance ; daily monitoring of possible clusters around our sites.

Access to facilities and visits

Against a backdrop of tougher traffic measures taken by all governments, and particularly in France, the Group is committed to maintaining the various social activities and visits in all its facilities, for the quality of life and comfort of residents and

patients. The only exceptions to this rule may be justified by the particular health situation of an establishment or on the explicit directive of the Health Authorities.

As a precautionary measure, however, visitors are asked to announce their presence and to comply with the strictest hygiene measures (wearing masks, maintaining a specific distance, and limited access to rooms).

In France in particular, ministerial instructions dated 20 November 2020 recommend that visitors be screened 72 hours before their visit by RT-PCR or during the day in a pharmacy by antigenic test.

As far as possible, we favour meetings in common areas, which are more spacious and more airy.

In addition, remote visits via Skype or Whatsapp are possible in the various facilities throughout the network. Dedicated applications have been deployed in Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands and France to facilitate contact with families and enable themselves to plan their visits.

We would like to salute the residents, families and all stakeholders for their spirit of responsibility and support during this period.
