Epidemic situation in Europe

The health situation in the countries where the group operates continues to improve, with the incidence* continuing to fall. It has even fallen below the 50/100,000 threshold in Germany and Italy.

Epidemic situation in the Korian network

The health situation in our network is following this very positive trend in connection with the high vaccination rates.

Thus, on 10 June, only 3 establishments still had 4 or more cases, i.e. less than 0.4% of the network of nursing homes (1 in France, 1 in Germany and 1 in Belgium). Only 0.1% of the residents and 0.2% of the staff (health and medico-social sector) were positive to the health Covid-19 in our network follows this very positive trend in connection with the high vaccination rates.

Vaccination campaign in the Korian network

Our vaccination rates are excellent, with 99% of residents and 76% of staff having received at least one dose of vaccine, and 92% of residents and 73% of staff fully protected. The team vaccination campaign in France is being actively pursued to reach 80%.

Testing policy

Around 80,000 tests are still carried out weekly with residents/patients or staff. The significant decrease in the number of tests carried out each week is linked to the relaxation of the rules due to the high vaccination rates. In Germany, for example, the frequency of testing for staff has been reduced from daily to weekly for facilities in an area with an incidence of 50/100,000 or less and a staff vaccination rate of over 70%.

Hygiene standard and preventive measures

The new mutations encourage us to remain vigilant in respecting barrier measures. Thus, reinforced measures have been taken within the network, notably the preventive reinforcement of stocks of personal protective equipment, the widening of safety distances as well as the daily surveillance of possible clusters around our sites.

Access to facilities, activities and visits

Given the confirmation of the effectiveness of the vaccine protection, outings and free visits are the rule. Except for a particular and temporary local situation, visits are now made without making an appointment for vaccinated persons.

Even if vigilance remains necessary with the threat of new variants, the Korian network has always been very careful to maintain the various social activities and visits in all its establishments, for the quality of life and comfort of residents and patients.
