Korian will go to court after the television broadcast “Pièces à Conviction” (“Pieces of Evidence”)

Particularly serious accusations were made during a tv program devoted to the Covid-19 crisis broadcast on France 3 on Wednesday, November 18, 2020, concerning the management of this crisis by the Korian Group.

The Group refutes with the utmost firmness the false allegations made, in particular concerning the management of masks and an alleged excess mortality in our network.

Faced with a new, particularly contagious virus, with mechanisms of propagation still largely unknown, threatening in particular the elderly and frail, and in the absence of preventive or curative treatments, the Group immediately mobilised by anticipating the instructions of the local health authorities, to the best of its ability based on available knowledge concerning the progression of the epidemic.

In addition, in a context of painful confinement, Korian did everything possible to inform the families and provide them with the best possible support.

In order to defend its employees, its integrity and its reputation, the Korian Group is therefore forced to take legal action to sue the authors of these unjustified, unfair and malicious accusations for defamation.
